BASI Alpine Level 2 Instructor Training

This is the second part of the ski instructor qualification. With your BASI ski instructor licence you can teach on snow in Scandinavia, Switzerland, Australia, New Zealand, USA and Canada.

Pre-requisites

Before applying, students must have the following:

- Successfully completed the Alpine Level 1 Instructor Course
- A thorough understanding of both the technical and teaching philosophy of BASI
- Attended a refresher course every 3 years
- 70 hours ski school experience with a BASI recognised snowsports school

Preparation Courses & Experience with New Generation

Following feedback from last year's students we are running several training courses for people who wish to fine tune their skiing before taking part in the courses. The Training also contributes to the ski school experience hours that are now a pre-requisite for attending the Alpine Level 2.

The Training Programme

This is a 10-day on-snow training and assessment course. Assessment will be continuous throughout the course. The content is based on the current Ski Instructor Course outcomes and includes on- and off-snow activities:

- Technical skiing (practical). A thorough grounding in the ski instructor technical syllabus (central theme)
- Ski teaching (practical). Training, analysis and practice of teaching skiing using the progression skills from the technical syllabus
- Client care

Theory and off-snow content

- Safety and fitness for skiing
- Communications
- Lesson planning
- Technical consolidation
- Principles and practice of ski teaching

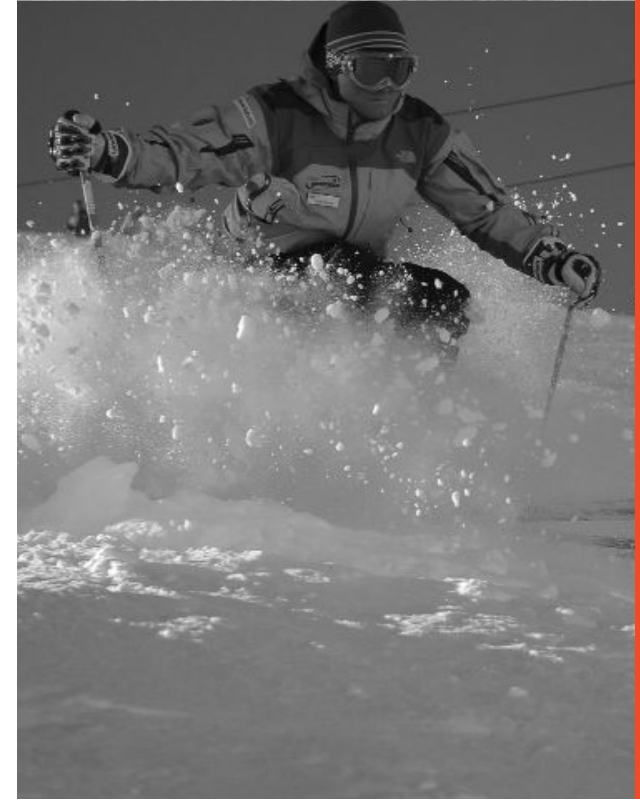
Outcome

Successful students will be able to ski to a competent level, and have the knowledge, ability and understanding to safely teach Alpine skiing up to and including parallel standard on marked pistes. Those who do not reach the required level may be required to re-sit all or part of the course.

Certification and Issue of your Ski Instructor Licence

A licence, which is renewable annually, can only be issued to students who have fulfilled the following conditions:

- Successful completion of the Alpine Level 1 & 2 Instructor Training Courses
- Have completed 70 hours ski school experience with a BASI recognised snowsports school.
- Be a minimum of 18 years old
- Hold a current first aid certificate issued by an organisation recognised by the Health and Safety Executive (the course must be a minimum of two days long)
- Have completed the BASI Child Protection Module
- Have paid the current full BASI membership fee
- Have attended a revalidation/refresher course every year unless they have attended another training course.





Course Dates and Fees

All course dates are on-snow dates and do NOT include travel time to and from the course. All of the courses run on-snow from Monday through to Friday and will start with a Sunday evening briefing and registration (normally 6pm).

BASI Membership

In order to participate in the Alpine Level 2 course, students are required to have up to date BASI associate membership. If the course is successfully completed students can then apply to BASI for full membership. For more information see www.basi.org.uk.

Insurance

Insurance is compulsory for attending a BASI course and before commencing the course your trainer will check that you are insured. New Generation does not offer any insurance cover. Please contact BASI for details of the new insurance that they are offering and for further advice.

Once your course is confirmed we will send you a comprehensive information pack with details of accommodation, transfers and lift passes (not included in the course fees). We also aim to put students in touch with each other prior to the course so you have the option to share travel costs etc.

The Preperation Course

The New Generation Preperation Course offers students the best support and preparation for the Alpine Level 2 Course. The step from Alpine Level 1 to Alpine Level 2 is a big one but with the help of our team of British coaches, students will be coached towards the key aspects of the level 2 assessment.

Our goal is to give you the technical knowledge and support you need to make you succeed in the next stage of your instructor career. The training courses have been specifically designed to prepare you for the Alpine Level 2 assessment.

The Alpine Level 2 Assessment

The training courses have been scheduled so they precede the Alpine Level 2 assessments in Courchevel.

Course Structure

The course runs for 5 hours on-snow each day with evening video feedback sessions. The 1 week course runs over 6 days, Sunday - Friday. The 2 week course runs Sunday - Friday in both weeks. Wednesday is a rest day and provides a back up if there is a bad weather day.

There is a maximum of 10 people per group (the same as the BASI Alpine Level 2).

Day 1 – Central Theme and fundamental elements

Day 2 – Working on the Central Theme

Day 3 – Perform teaching sessions and progression of fundamental elements

Day 4 – Introducing the 5 strands beyond the central theme

Day 5 – Perform outstanding or second teaching sessions/communication

Day 6 – Clarifying personal performance

Day 7 – Exploring the teaching styles and more teaching delivery

Day 8 – Central theme and the 5 strands

Day 9 – Last teaching sessions

Day 10 – Personal Performance and the 5 strands

Ski School Experience Weeks

The new BASI rules state that once you have completed your Alpine Level 1 Instructor course, you need a First Aid Certificate, your child protection module and 35 hours ski school experience before you can work on a dry / indoor slope.

Before you can attend your Level 2 Instructor Course a minimum of 70 hours of ski school experience is required. Here at New Generation we find shadowing and taking part in lessons delivered by our fully qualified instructors to be the most effective way of gaining ski school experience. So why not join us on one of our ski school experience weeks.

The New Generation course gives you 35 hours of Ski School Experience. At the end of the course we will give you a letter confirming these hours. You will then need to pass this on to BASI.

Who can apply? Anyone who has successfully completed their Alpine Level 1 Instructor Course.

Stage 1: Select the course you wish to join. e.g. BASI Alpine Level 2
